

Housing Stabilization Program



If you live in the City of Pittsburgh and are in need of rental, utility, or mortgage assistance, contact United Way of Southwestern Pennsylvania 2-1-1 for more information on the Housing Stabilization Program.

The Housing Stabilization Program (HSP) is a housing crisis intervention program that provides one-time or short term financial assistance to households who are facing a temporary, non-recurring housing crisis.

One-time funding support includes:

- 1) Move-in assistance which may include:
 - First month's rent
 - Last month's rent
 - Security deposit
 - Utility deposits
- 2) Utilities in arrears
- 3) Rent in arrears
- 4) Mortgage payment (must not have an Act 91 notice)
- 5) Legal fees

Short-term funding support includes:

- 1) Rent subsidy, not to exceed three (3) months
- 2) Mortgage assistance, not to exceed six (6) months
- 3) Legal services throughout the eviction process
- 4) Legal fees related to court

To see if you are eligible for the program, please contact United Way 211. Contact information is on the back of the flyer.

Eligibility Requirements:

- Must be a renter or homeowner
- Must live in the City of Pittsburgh
- Renters must be at or below 50% AMI*
- Homeowners must be at or below 80% AMI*
- Must develop a stability plan with a service provider
